Project Update

- RWWA Board has approved in-principle grant funding & authority to issue tenders.
 - Construction tender for training surfaces released last week.
 - Construction tender for stalls to be distributed by the end of February.
- RWWA & Bunbury Turf Club working with City of Bunbury to obtain necessary development & environmental approvals.
- The City of Bunbury's Notice of Public Advertisement of Planning Proposal for the redevelopment will run concurrently with the tender processes.
- Training will continue to be available at Bunbury Turf Club until end of April 2020.
- Civil works expected to commence May 2020.
- Following commencement of construction, training will not be available at Bunbury Turf Club for approximately 12 months.
- RWWA expects to be able to schedule a return to racing at Bunbury in late 2021.




Alternate Racing, Trialling and Training options

- Race meetings will be allocated to other venues during the closure RWWA is in discussion with Perth Racing on extending the Belmont Park season.
- Trial fees for Bunbury based trainers at other venues will be waived.
- Collie Race Club track is being resurfaced to a similar surface to the current track at Bunbury will be available 6 days a week.
- Bunbury Turf Club to ensure an optimum surface at Collie provided for trainers.
- Lark Hill training facility to also be available track fees will be waived.
- Subsidy of \$10 per horse per day as a contribution to travel costs incurred to work horses.
- Staff at Collie and Lark Hill will record daily numbers of horses.
- Other initiatives to support trainers?




Project Timeline





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





Project Overview – Track

- 20-metre-wide turf track
- 17-metre-wide sand/fibre training track (200mm deep)
- Ambulance track
- Appropriate drainage across all tracks
- Fully irrigated over the 3 tracks (including the realigned jog track)
- New pump house/filtration system (located infield)
- Triax cabling
- Relocation of Steward Towers
- New Dams







Project Overview – Stalls

- 150 + stalls (currently 165)
- Wash bays
- Swabbing boxes
- Permanent cover over stalls
- Consider heat escape and ventilation
- Create separation between owner & horse
- Distance to public buildings currently 21 metres likely update to 10 metres as part of LAP
- Drainage Horse waste separation
- Integration connection with horse float area
- Asphalt stalls and horse float area
- Integration and connection with course proper and

training tracks

- Integration and connection with mounting yard
- Addition of water catchment options tanks
- Lighting/electrical connection
- Toilets
- Viewing Deck
- Check in Control
- Teas & Coffee area
- Traffic management from horse float park (including gates & fence line)
- Further consultation with industry will occur before the design is finalised
